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Clifton Public Schools Make Impact on Cancer Cures through Pennies for Patients

Students in Clifton Public Schools raised \$27,353,18 to help fund blood cancer research and provide help and hope to thousands of patients and their families through The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's (LLS) Pennies for Patients program.

The Pennies for Patients Awards Celebration took place virtually on May 27, 2020. School 12 won the Social Butterfly Award, and Dr. Danny Robertozzi won the "Super" Superintendent Award.

"I knew that a Clifton Public Schools and Pennies for Patients and the LLS would be an invaluable partnership when the organization reached out to me last summer," said Dr. Robertozzi, Clifton Superintendent.

"Our students had an opportunity to raise awareness for LLS and make a positive impact by helping other children," Robertozzi continued. "In addition to teaching empathy and compassion, these powerful life lessons show our students that they can make a real difference in the world around them. I'm so proud of

our students, teachers, and principals, particularly since school participation continued remotely despite the setback of school closures due to COVID-19."

By signing up for LLS's Pennies for Patients fundraising campaign, students learned leadership, the importance of helping others and just how impactful their involvement can be in helping to save lives. During the programs, students and staff collected donations from friends and family in honor of local student survivors and current patients. By contributing their spare change and participating in other special fundraising events, Clifton Schools are helping LLS fund lifesaving research.

"Because of new and better therapies, blood cancer survival rates for children have improved significantly during the last several decades," said Genna Toye, LLS New Jersey Pennies for Patients Director. "But there still more work to be done. Leukemia is one of the most common types of cancer in children and adolescents, so LLS's Pennies for Patients programs provide a meaningful way for kids to help kids. Every penny really does make a difference."

Since it began in 1993, Pennies for Patients has helped LLS invest nearly \$1.3 billion in research to advance breakthrough cancer treatments that are saving lives and improving the quality of life for patients and their families. In the last 3 years, LLS has designed a series of lesson plans for teachers to use in the classroom in response to the growing trend of making serving learning and character education part of the curriculum. The lesson plans integrate the theme of LLS's Pennies for Patients® programs into all academic areas, including a renewed emphasis on social and emotional learning in this virtual learning environment.
