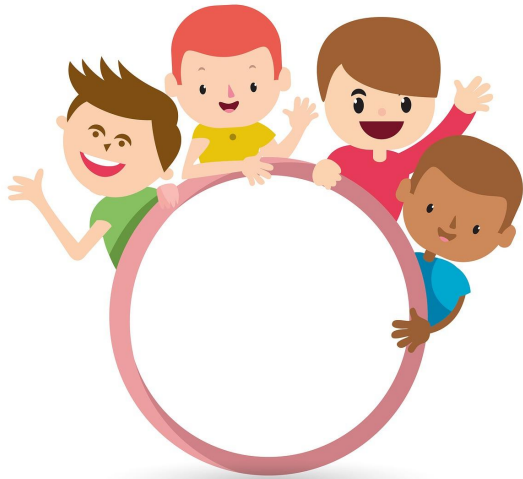

NJ PBSIS

School 13 has partnered with NJ Positive Behavior Support in Schools (NJ PBSIS) to help us develop an intervention continuum to plan for preventing and, when necessary, intervening with social, behavior, and conduct issues.

Each school, through student and staff input, determines their 3 pillars that they will strive towards. School 13's pillars are:

- ★ **KINDNESS**
- ★ **SAFETY**
- ★ **RESPECT**

How does it work?

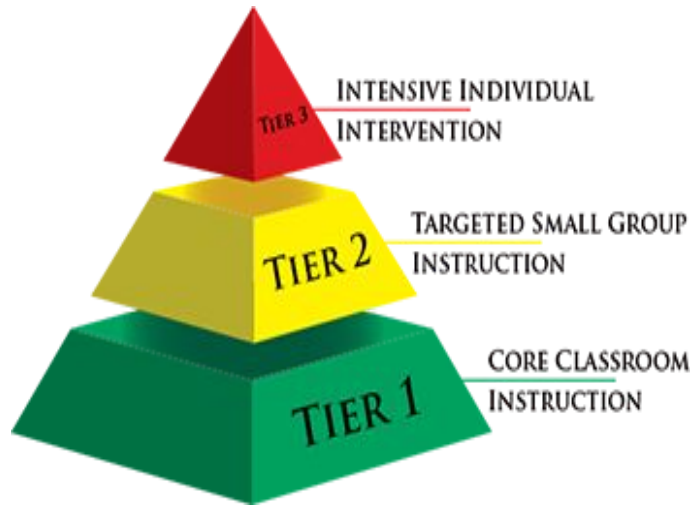
Through a 4:1 positive to negative correction ratio, students will be taught the school wide expectations. Expectation posters will be displayed throughout the school and reviewed frequently for reinforcement. Expectations and routines will be modeled frequently. These expectations will also be utilized to reinforce appropriate expected behaviors in any school setting.

Overview

It is not a curriculum - it is a framework for systems to identify needs, develop strategies, and evaluate practice toward success.

PBSIS is a tiered system of support, which is driven by data.

The framework of each tier is designed with a specific purpose and an aligned set of practices.
