NJ PBSIS OVERVIEW

REWARDS

School 14 has partnered with NJ Positive Behavior Support in Schools (NJ PBSIS) to help us develop an intervention continuum to plan for preventing and, when necessary, intervening with social, behavior, and conduct issues.

Each school, through student and staff input, determines their pillars of success. School 14 focuses on Kindness, Respect, Acceptance, and Safety.

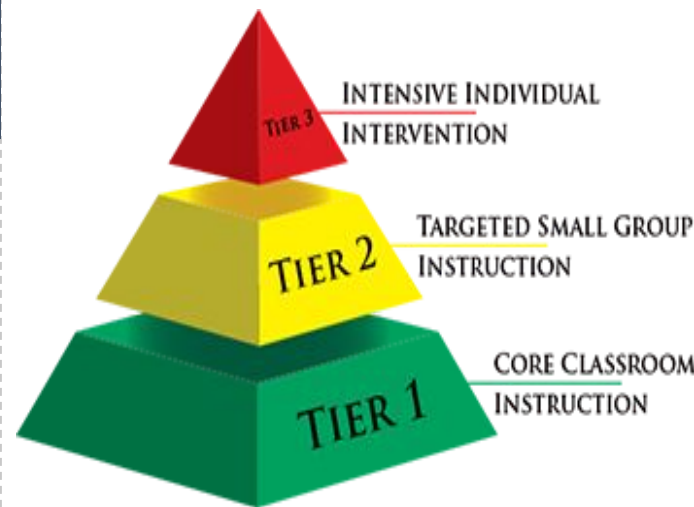
How does it work?

Through a 4:1 positive to negative correction ratio, students will be taught the school wide expectations. Expectation posters will be displayed throughout the school and reviewed frequently for reinforcement. Expectations and routines will be modeled frequently. These expectations will also be utilized to reinforce appropriate expected behaviors in any school setting.

It is not a curriculum - it is a framework for systems to identify needs, develop strategies, and evaluate practice toward success.

PBSIS is a tiered system of support, which is driven by data.

The framework of each tier is designed with a specific purpose and an aligned set of practices.



When students are found following school wide expectations and displaying positive behaviors, they can earn **HUSKY BUCKS!**

Husky Bucks will be handed out throughout the day and can be used to purchase passes and prizes from our Pack Shack. This is our way of recognizing and rewarding positive behavior.
